Are Mormons and/or Jehovah Witnesses Saved

- 1. Salvation comes by Faith in Jesus Christ and his death on the cross, not by any works that we do.
- 2. Is belief in the Trinity and the true nature of God necessary for salvation?
- 3. Is belief in Christ's full deity and humanity necessary for salvation?
- 4. Our responsibility: Love people; pray for them; work with them when we have shared values and beliefs whenever possible.
