1.	In Pastor Harry's 1/26/21 entry, <i>Pray</i> , he challenged us with a question: what kind of letter will you spread out before the LORD today? How would you construct your letter? Look at Hezekiah's prayer in 2 Kings 19:14-19: what was in it, what was <i>not</i> in it - and what was God's response? What if He were for you, and responded BIG against your storm?

Part 4 - Pastor Jared Herd

Present sacrifice. Eternal investment.

Scripture: Romans 8:18-19, 31-32

- 1. Pastor Jared shared about his personal mentor in high school, who spent invaluable time with him that had long term impact in his life. Has anyone ever done that for you? Are you willing to do something for someone without knowing what the outcome will be?
- 2. The Apostle Paul taught us to look at our deficits in life as deposits. Why does the 'whole cake' kind of person find it hard to operate under deficits? How is 'more than a conqueror' more like the 'one slice of cake' person? Which one are you?

- 3. What did you learn about how God's economy (more with less) works? Gideon had his troops cut back. Five loaves and two fish, really? When God places a limit on us, what is He doing? How do His cutbacks actually create increase for His Kingdom?
- 4. Why does God ask us to sacrifice now? What did He lose in order for you to gain? What if... God were to use your sacrifices and sufferings today to make something better tomorrow? Would your sacrifice be worth it? Would you do it?

- 1. What parts, if any, of this teaching were new to you or surprised you in any way?
- 2. In what ways does the narrative of Exodus remind you of the narrative of our country? In what ways does it remind you of the narrative of your own life? (Ideas: seeking freedom, overcoming adversity, leaning on our turning from God in times of trouble....)
- 3. Read Numbers 22-24. How does the account of Balaam and his donkey parallel the account of Israel and God? How does it parallel your relationship with God?
- 4. God is faithful and expects us to be faithful, which we are not. Fortunately, Jesus paid the price for our unfaithfulness. However, the standard is still faithfulness. What does faithfulness to God look like in your life?
