- Scriptures: John 13:1-17; James 1:22-25 (see Message Notes on your CRB App for the NT Wright and Phillip Yancey quotes)
- 1. What impacted or challenged you in today's message?
- 2. Why does consistent humility (humbleness) characterize Jesus' ministry? Why is it important to understand Jesus came as a servant a different kind of script?
- 3. What were the disciples not understanding about why Jesus came? (Remember the two Greek words Pastor Ken shared: LOUW wash entirely; NIPTW washing a part of the body)
- 4. What does "repent" mean? Why is it important that we repent daily? Does this understanding make obedience to God's commands easier for you, or harder?

- 5. Why did Jesus wash everyone's feet at the table, knowing what he knew about them? What does this reveal about your own willingness to serve others?
- 6. Describe a time when you have experienced the truth of this statement: "What seems like sacrifice becomes instead a kind of nourishment because dispensing grace enriches the giver as well as the receiver." *Phillip Yancey, Vanishing Grace Whatever Happened to the Good News?*
- 7. Discuss the qualities necessary in a servant-leader. (See quote by NT Wright) What changes do you need to make in order to follow a servant-leader, and be a servant-leader?
- 8. What is the role of the Holy Spirit in servant-leadership?
- 9. Who can you identify today to figuratively "wash their feet"?
